New Year's Day Recipes

Black-Eyed Peas



Ingredients

- 1 pound dry black-eyed peas 2 cups chopped cooked ham salt and pepper to taste
- 1 pinch garlic powder
- 2 onions, diced
- 1 (14.5 ounce) can whole tomatoes

Directions

Place black-eyed peas in 8 quart pot. Add enough water to fill pot 3/4 full. Stir in ham and diced onions, and season with salt, pepper, and garlic powder. Place tomatoes in a blender or food processor, and blend until the tomatoes are liquefied. Add tomatoes to pot. Bring all ingredients to boil. Cover the pot, and simmer on low heat for 2-1/2 to 3 hours, or until the peas are tender.

Vasilopita



One of the most beautiful and inspiring traditions of the Greek Orthodox Church is the observance of Vasilopita. The word Vasilopita is a compound Greek word which means the sweet 'bread of Basil'.

This age old tradition commenced in the fourth century, when Saint Basil the Great, who was a bishop, wanted to distribute money to the poor in his Diocese. He commissioned some women to bake sweetened bread, in which he arranged to place gold coins. In cutting the bread to nourish themselves, the families were pleasantly surprised to find the coins.

So of course now, whomever receives the piece of Vasilopita with the coin is promised good luck for the new year!

Vasilopita (New Year's Bread) By Helen Bereolos

1/2 lb. butter or margarine2 cups sugar1 cup milk5 cups flour3 heaping tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt
6 eggs
5 to 6 pieces mastika gum
1 jigger whiskey
1 tsp. baking soda
Juice of 1/2 lemon
1 cup chopped nuts
Sesame seeds

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Melt butter. Let cool. Beat with electric mixer until light and fluffy.

Heat milk until warm. Dissolve sugar in warm milk. Combine milk/sugar mixture with butter. Combine baking powder, flour, and salt. Sift this mixture. Crush the gum into powder. Combine 5 eggs, crushed mastika gum powder, and nuts. Dissolve baking soda with lemon juice and whiskey. Add the sifted baking powder/flour/salt mixture to the butter/milk/sugar mixture. Next add the eggs, crushed mastika gum powder mixture. Add the baking soda/lemon juice/whiskey mixture last.

Beat entire mixture well and pour into greased, floured baking pan. Beat one egg and brush mixture over top of batter. Sprinkle with sesame seeds.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 45 minutes or until done.

Tasty Collard Greens

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic
- 5 cups chicken stock
- 1 smoked turkey drumstick
- 5 bunches collard greens rinsed,
- trimmed and chopped
- salt and black pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon crushed red pepper flakes (optional)

Directions

Heat olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add garlic, and gently saute until light brown. Pour in the chicken stock, and add the turkey leg. Cover the pot, and simmer



for 30 minutes.

Add the collard greens to the cooking pot, and turn the heat up to medium-high. Let the greens cook down for about 45 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Reduce heat to medium, and season with salt and pepper to taste. Continue to cook until the greens are tender and dark green, 45 to 60 minutes. Drain greens, reserving liquid. Mix in red pepper flakes if desired. Use liquid to reheat leftovers.

Corned Beef and Cabbage



Ingredients

- 1 medium onion, cut into wedges
- 4 medium potatoes, peeled and quartered
- 1 pound baby carrots
- 3 cups water
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

1 (3 pound) corned beef brisket with spice packet, cut in half

1 small head cabbage, cut into wedges

Directions

Place the onion, potatoes and carrots in a 5-qt. slow cooker. Combine water, garlic, bay leaf, sugar, vinegar, pepper and contents of spice packet; pour over vegetables. Top with brisket and cabbage. Cover and cook on low for 8-9 hours or until meat and vegetables are tender. Remove bay leaf before serving.

FOR LUCK IN THE NEW YEAR

Traditionally, it was thought that one could affect the luck they would have throughout the coming year by what they did or ate on the first day of the year. For that reason, it has become common for folks to celebrate the first few minutes of a brand new year in the company of family and friends. Parties often last into the middle of the night after the ringing in of a new vear (vou don't say). It was once believed that the first visitor on New Year's Day would bring either good luck or bad luck the rest of the year. It was particularly lucky if that visitor happened to be a tall dark-haired man. (I can rent out Demetrius to you -- he still has hair.)

Traditional New Year foods are also thought to bring luck. Many cultures believe that anything in the shape of a ring is good luck, because it symbolizes "coming full circle," completing a year's cycle. For that reason, the Dutch believe that eating donuts on New Year's Day will bring good fortune. (I see Deme driving off to Krispy Kremes now, with a valid excuse!)

Many parts of the U.S. celebrate the new year by consuming black-eyed peas. These legumes are typically accompanied by either hog jowls or ham. Black-eyed peas and other legumes have been considered good luck in many cultures. The hog, and thus its meat, is considered lucky because it symbolizes prosperity. Cabbage is another "good luck" vegetable that is

consumed on New Year's Day by many. Cabbage leaves are also considered a sign of prosperity, being representative of paper currency. In some regions, rice is a lucky food that is eaten on New Year's Day.

AULD LANG SYNE

The song, "Auld Lang Syne," playing in the background, is sung at the stroke of midnight in almost every English-speaking country in the world to bring in the new year. At least partially written by Robert Burns in the 1700's, it was first published in 1796 after Burns' death. Early variations of the song were sung prior to 1700 and inspired Burns to produce the modern rendition. An old Scotch tune, "Auld Lang Syne" literally means "old long ago," or simply, "the good old days."

Tulsa Day Center for the Homeless



The Day Center serves an average of 400 individuals on a daily basis. At night, they house approximately 115 men and women. Each person can utilize the services available including the Nurse Clinic, laundry facility, restroom and showers, and Community Voice Mail.

Each morning they provide those who spent the night with

a breakfast of cereal or oatmeal. Their eviction prevention case managers work with individuals to prevent homelessness. Bus tokens are distributed by case managers for those who need transportation to a job or doctor's appointment.

They do all this to fulfill their mission of providing a safe and healthy environment for people who are homeless and offer them opportunities and encouragement for achieving self-sufficiency.

And when the homeless are able to move on . . .

The House Warming Project is a way for groups or individuals to help provide each new household with the basics needed in their transition to self-sufficiency.


