

Recipes for the new year!

I'm guessing that dieting or perhaps just eating more healthy is in our plans for the new year, so here are a few recipes to get us motivated!

Butternut Squash & Kale Quesadillas

by Ree Drummond, The Pioneer Woman



Ingredients

1/2 whole Butternut Squash, Peeled, Seeded, And Diced.

2 Tablespoons Butter

1 Tablespoon Olive Oil

1/2 teaspoon Kosher Salt

Black Pepper To Taste

1/4 teaspoon Chili Powder (more To Taste)

1 bunch Kale, Leaves Torn, Stalks Discarded

8 whole Small (fajita Sized) Flour Tortillas

Extra Butter For Frying

2-1/2 cups Monterey Jack Cheese, Grated

Sour Cream For Serving

Cilantro, For Serving

Pico De Gallo, Salsa, Avocado Slices (optional) For Serving

Preparation Instructions

Heat 1 tablespoon butter and olive oil in a large skillet over high heat. Add squash and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and chili powder. Cook for several minutes, turning gently with a spatula, until squash is deep golden brown and tender (but not falling apart.) Remove to a plate and set aside.

In the same skillet, melt 1 tablespoon of butter over medium-high heat and add in the kale. Toss it around with tongs and cook it for 3 to 4 minutes. Add in the cooked squash and gently toss together. Set aside.

In a separate skillet, melt additional butter and lightly brown both sides of the 8 tortillas. Build the quesadillas one by one by adding a layer of cheese topped with a layer of the squash/kale mixture, topped with a second tortilla. You'll have four quesadillas when you're done.

Brown each quesadilla on both sides, adding more butter to the pan to make sure tortillas are nice and golden and yummy.

When the cheese is melted, remove each quesadilla from the skillet and cut it into four wedges. Serve with sour cream, cilantro, pico de gallo, salsa, avocado...or any sides you'd like!

(Note: The butternut squash/kale mixture is also great tossed with a little pasta and olive oil, and topped with Parmesan shavings!)

Salsa Chicken



Ingredients
4 skinned boned chicken breast halves
3/4 cup salsa
1/2 cup sliced green onions
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Preheat oven to 350*F. Place chicken in an 11×7 -inch baking dish coated with cooking spray. Spoon salsa evenly over chicken; top with green onions. Sprinkle with cheese. Cover and bake for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake an additional 10 minutes or until chicken is done. Serve with hot cooked rice or side salad.

Lori's White Fish



Ingredients
white fish (such as tilapia, basa or orange roughy)
peppers (green, red, or yellow)
yellow onion
tomato soup
white wine
rice

Saute sliced peppers and sliced onions in olive oil and garlic. Place fish in baking dish and top with tomato soup, peppers and onions. Pour in a little white wine. Bake at 350-degrees for about 20 minutes and serve over cooked rice.

Sauteed Kale

by Bobby Flay



Ingredients

1 1/2 pounds young kale, stems and leaves coarsely chopped

3 tablespoons olive oil

2 cloves garlic, finely sliced

1/2 cup vegetable stock or water

Salt and pepper

2 tablespoons red wine vinegar

Directions

Heat olive oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add the garlic and cook until soft, but not colored. Raise heat to high, add the stock and kale and toss to combine. Cover and cook for 5 minutes. Remove cover and continue to cook, stirring until all the liquid has evaporated. Season with salt and pepper to taste and add vinegar.

[Lori's note: I tried to saute kale and it tasted bitter, so I found Bobby's recipe. I used homemade chicken broth and cooked it a little longer than he suggested - really good! I also did not add the vinegar.]






